Concepts of Poverty

Poverty mainly can be classified in two ways, these two are focused on Income and Consumption:

- 1. Absolute Poverty
- 2. Relative Poverty

What is Absolute Poverty?

- * The concept of absolute poverty is measured with reference to income of the people which is required to meet the minimum basic needs
- * This concept measures poverty only in relation to the amount of money necessary to meet basic needs such as food, clothing, shelter, safe drinking water, education, healthcare, etc.
- It is based on required money for the basic needs for livelihood

What is Absolute Poverty?

- * Through a survey method, consumption expenditure of the households is calculated to measure income poverty
- * Thus consumption expenditure is considered as a proxy for income
- * Both the concepts of poverty namely, Head Count Ratio (HCR) and Poverty Gap (PG) are measures of income poverty

What is Absolute Poverty?

- * The economic condition of the country does not affect the status of poor people (Absolute Poverty) living in that country
- In other words, regardless of how rich and successful the economy is, people living in absolute poverty have no benefits of the economic prosperity of their country
